TOP TEN ENCOURAGEMENTS FOR STUDYING THE BIBLE

- 1. Don't worry if you miss a day here and there. You aren't being graded on reading. But don't abuse this freedom. Going without reading is like going without food and water.
- 2. Find your own rhythms and what works best for you. Don't worry if someone else's plan is not for you. They may be thinking the same thing.
- 3. If you get stuck on a passage, don't be discouraged. Ask the Holy Spirit for wisdom. Reach out to someone to help you interpret or research it through trusted sources.
- 4. Don't neglect the cross references in the margins or any translation notes. They can provide context for illumination.
- 5. Look for application to your present life, but not exclusively. Read and process the text as it is. Not every passage is going to have a direct, clear application to something you are facing. But The Word will never find Itself void.
- 6. Ask yourself how the passage reflects Christ, points to the Messiah, or informs us about God's character. The Bible is not a "how to" manual. It is God's story of redemption.
- 7. Try different translations and different types of Study Bibles (The Message is not a translation). They can help bring out subtle points that you might have missed in earlier readings.
- 8. The Bible is less like a "normal" book and more like a diamond with multiple layers and facets. When reading, try to look at it from different viewpoints.
- 9. Don't worry if you don't understand something. You might read the same passage 9 times and not notice or understand it but the next time you read it, the Holy Spirit may illuminate it for you.
- 10. READ SLOW! Also take much care when reading don't simply read it through a 21st century American lens. Study also from the lens of the time each book was written, to whom it was written, and who the Holy Spirit inspired authors were. (This takes some practice to do)
