Introduction

The moment of Jesus' crucifixion is at hand. What does Jesus do? He pauses to pray and the disciples listen to an UNEXPECTED PRAYER between Jesus and the Father. He longs for the glory he enjoyed before there was any created thing, but in his kindness he prays for the Holy Father to watch over his friends.

Christians live in the world, but Jesus still intercedes with the Father on our behalf. Jesus wants us to have his joy, to be set apart by holy lives, and to live with the mission always in front of us. This UNEXPECTED PRAYER is for you.

Outline

Prayer changes the way we see everything else (v. 1).

Eternal life is not something you add, it is a new spiritual condition and reality (vv. 2-3).

When you treasure Christ, you keep his word (v. 6).

Disciples should be a vehicle for God's glory (v. 10).
