Introduction

Breakfast was relatively quiet, and few questions were asked (John 21:12). The sense of awe remains as the disciples share a meal with the risen Christ. John tells us this was the third time Jesus had appeared to the disciples. He has given them peace. He has commissioned them, but now, Jesus begins to address the elephant in the room regarding Peter and his denial. The question, "Do you love me more than these?" must have broken Peter's heart.

Jesus has not come to be unkind to Peter or to pour salt in the wound; he has come on a restoration mission. The sin was public, and now the denier would be publicly reinstated. Failure does not have the final word for a Christian. Jesus assures Peter every step of the way and reminds him that the call has not changed—follow me. As the Gospel According to John closes, we are reminded of the witness God provides through his written word and the majesty of the eternal Word made flesh, Jesus the Christ.

Outline

Sin comes with consequences (v. 15).

Conviction of sin is God's kindness. When confronted about your sin, it is not for your condemnation but for your restoration (vv. 15-19).

Repentance is more than apologizing to God and feeling bad. True repentance is only possible through the work of the Holy Spirit (v. 17).

The sheep belong to Jesus, but he calls pastors to feed and care for his flock (v. 17).

Following Jesus is an eternal and glorious calling (v. 19).

It doesn't take long to get turned around and set our eyes on the wrong things (vv. 20-23).

Scripture is sufficient and gives us exactly what we need (vv. 24-25).

Do you love Jesus enough for your sin to trouble you?

Are you following Jesus right now?
